石油危機以降の先進諸国経済の最も顕著な特徴はインフレ率の低位収斂である。本講は、経済国際化がデイスインフレ政策に至る過程は国内の制度的相違により幾つかに類型化できるという仮説の妥当性を議論し、その過程で経済国際化の国内的影響の関する先端的業績を概観する。教師の仮説や先端的諸議論の理論的・建設的批判を通しての分析枠組の構築の修練を積む機会を参加者には提供したい。
